1. Situation

State of Tennessee Emergency Management Plan is activated and the SEOC is activated at a Level 3– State of Emergency at 0300 hours on March 3rd, 2020.

On 03/03/2020, a storm system moved through the State of Tennessee, bringing tornadic activity, heavy rains, hail, and powerful winds through the west and middle regions of the state. Confirmed tornado travelled through portions of Davidson, Wilson and Putnam Counties. This tornado left a wide path of destruction with multiple fatalities reported (24 fatalities as of 1600 hours), homes destroyed, businesses destroyed, widespread power outages, and significant damage to some educational facilities. Davidson County, Putnam County, Wilson County, City of Lebanon, and City of Mt. Juliet have declared a State of Emergency.

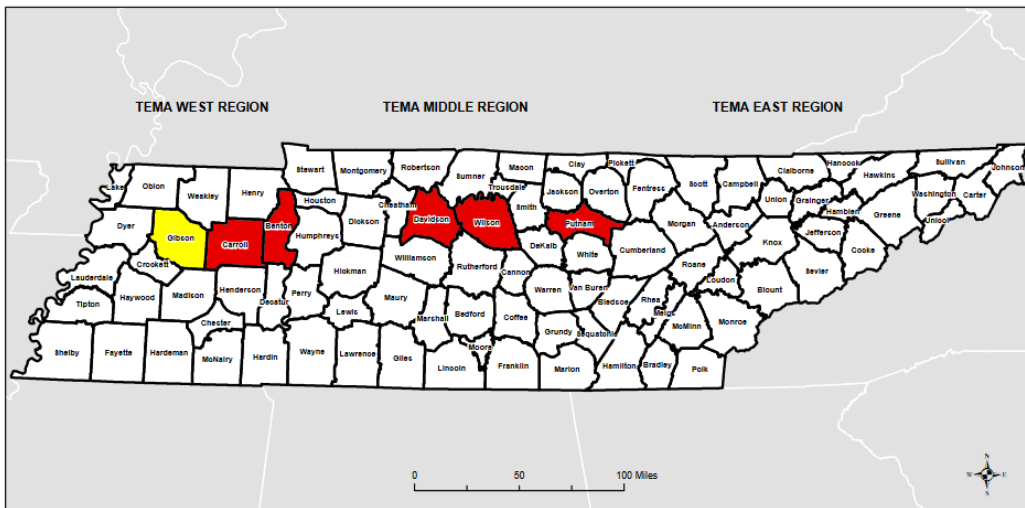
2. Lifeline Status – Middle Region



LIFELINE	Status Update
Safety and Security	Downed power lines, trees, and debris scattered throughout the affected area posing a significant safety concern for the public. Ongoing SAR and firefighting operations.
Food, Water, Shelter	Multiple homes and residences destroyed, several shelters established, and additional sheltering needs are being planned.
Health and Medical	24 confirmed tornado related fatalities and multiple injuries being reported
Energy (Power and Fuel)	Multiple power and transmission lines down across the region. A reported 48,000+ are reported without power
Transportation	Interstate Highways have been cleared and are all open. Several isolated state routes still need attention. Music City Star cannot operate due to debris and fallen trees. CSX Transportation states that Railroad Traffic on CSX Mainlines through Nashville are all now open, and normal operation has resumed.

WEST

- **Overnight:** Mostly cloudy, with a low around 43. A 40 percent chance of showers, mainly after midnight. Calm wind.
Thursday: Mostly cloudy through mid morning, then gradual clearing, with a high near 63. A 20 percent chance of showers before noon. Calm wind becoming west northwest around 5 mph.

MIDDLE

- **Overnight:** Mostly cloudy, with a low around 42. A 20 percent chance of showers after 5am. North northeast wind around 5 mph.
- **Thursday:** Partly sunny, with a high near 60. 40 percent chance of showers, mainly before 11am. North northeast wind around 5 mph becoming southwest in the afternoon.

- **Davidson County**
 - 2 confirmed fatalities
 - All searches have been completed in the Downtown area.
 - Searches still in progress in the Hermitage and Donelson areas.
 - Partially activated at the EOC 3/3/2020 0300 hours.
 - 35,000 reported without power
 - Significant damage reported to Robert Churchwell Elementary, Lockeland Design Center Elementary, and Meigs Magnet Middle School.
 - Relocation plan is being established for students.
 - Shelters are being reevaluated. At least one shelter is located in a private school that intends to reopen.
 - Currently have 4 shelters open.
 - Community Care and Hands on Nashville are the primary sources for volunteers.
 - OEM is beginning to do windshield surveys and are self-reporting in their own software.

- **Wilson County**
 - 3 confirmed fatalities
 - All rescue operations have been completed.
 - Reported 5,000 Reported without power.
 - Major damage to multiple structures throughout the county, many homes and businesses damaged/destroyed.
 - Significant damage reported to West Wilson Middle School and Stoner Creek Elementary. Both are reported as a total loss.
 - School transportation office damaged – every bus on the lot has damage.
 - Lebanon special school district – no damages.
 - Multiple injuries reported and transported.
 - Command posts set up in the City of Mt. Juliet and Lebanon.
 - County EOC activated.
 - Many roads impassable.
 - County schools are closed for the week.
 - Beginning damage assessments.
 - **Putnam County**
 - 18 confirmed fatalities, 1 is an unidentified female.
 - Hospital has treated a total of 88 patients.
 - Reported 8,000+ without power.
 - Approximately 300 responders in the area performing search and rescue operations.
 - TBI and our law enforcement partners have been able to verify that 158 persons previously reported missing in the Putnam County area have been accounted for alive.
 - Current total listed as missing is 8 as of 1400 on 3/4/2020.
 - Grid searches in progress.
 - Reunification site set up at Cookeville Regional Hospital
 - No major damage reported to schools.
 - Schools are closed for the remainder of the week.
 - Multiple powerlines down.
 - Communication systems continue to have significant disruption.
 - Command center being set up around Dipsy Doodle.
 - Knoxville Fire Department Structural Collapse Team located in Cookeville to assist Putnam County.
 - Multiple rescue squads in the Cookeville area.
 - Putnam County Sheriff's Office plans to allow media open access to damaged areas within the county.
 - Distribution Center has been set up at the Cookeville Community Center, located at 240 Carlen Dr. in Cookeville.

- Shelters are expected to close by this evening, only 6 people stayed in shelters last night and all are expected to leave shelters today.
- Volunteer Coordination Center stood up this morning had about 3,000 volunteers show up. Volunteers overwhelmed the area and impeded traffic and SAR efforts. Steps are being taken to mitigate this for the future.
- **Smith County**
 - No fatalities
 - 5 transported to hospital on 3/3/2020.
 - Damage reported in the Gordonsville and New Middleton areas.
 - No rescues have been performed.
 - 7-8 homes destroyed; 20 houses somewhat impacted.
 - Debris has been major but crews are already working on road cleanup.

WEST

- 1 confirmed fatality in Benton County
- NSW confirmed EF-2 tornado in Benton County, EF-2 tornado in Carroll County. They were separate tornadoes.
- Multiple trees and power lines down, several homes damaged/destroyed.
- Two reported injuries.
- Debris removal and cleanup has begun.

EAST

- Continued issues with Verizon service in the area.
- NWS Morristown confirmed EF-0 tornado.
- Tree damage reported.
- TEMA Car 325 (Hall) and Car 335 (Ritzman) have been assigned to assist in Putnam County.

- 64 personnel deployed to Putnam County, currently on 2 day orders, but may be extended.
- Several trucks deployed to Putnam County carrying Water and other supplies.

Infrastructure Branch

(ESF-1) TRANSPORTATION

- All interstates are open in all directions; several isolated state routes still require attention.
 - Music City Star will not be operating today due to debris. 2 areas along lines still need to be cleared. Nashville OEM and NES are working with Railroad Officials to get these cleared.
 - 9 WeGo bus routes are on detours or not running.
 - CSX Transportation states that Railroad Traffic on CSX Mainlines through Nashville are all now open, and normal operation has resumed.
 - Overturned vehicles have been up righted and removed from roadways.
 - TDOT Region 3 is operating on the Metro RDIO System A-Bank A-5.
 - The Cumberland River is shutdown at mile marker 182, which is impacting river travel to fuel terminals in downtown Nashville.
 - TDOT strike teams deployed to Wilson County to help with debris removal.

- Federal Motor Carriers Safety Administration (FMCSA) issued an emergency declaration, effective immediately and will remain in effect until 11:59 pm ET April 2, 2020

(ESF-2) COMMUNICATIONS

- Both towers at TACN site Nashville are destroyed.
- Motorola Disaster Emergency Team has arrived and began work on TACN site. Estimate at least 36 hours before system is restored, possibly up to 72 hours.
- TACN has made a request to ESF 2 to relocate T 1 and Metro E Lines due to building collapse / damage at TACN Master Site
- Radio system is down on TACN system along with TEMA ops
- Verizon in process of supporting cellular and WIFI capabilities.
- Continue to work on establishing communications with utilities.
- 200 FirstNet phones have been delivered, 180 to THP, 20 to Putnam County.

(ESF-3) INFRASTRUCTURE

- Nashville central wastewater treatment has procured and expects they will receive generators soon
- 5 Water Treatment plants in Putnam County that were affected are all online, 4 on wired power, 1 on generator.
- There were no damages to the infrastructure of any dams in the affected counties.
- Wilson County has been approved for debris staging at the county land fill.
- Davidson County Public Works has been verbally approved for 3 debris staging areas.
- Currently working with TDOT region 3 for additional debris staging.
- **Debris Task Force**
 - Set up to support local EOCs in debris removal and cleanup requests.
 - Currently focused on public messaging, working with PIO on materials for distribution.
 - Developing training programs for debris monitoring and removal.

(ESF-11) Food

- Field Inspectors / visiting facilities in all affected counties to determine facility damage, and imminent health issues affecting the foods being dispensed.
- Loss of electricity, loss of water, holding of foods, food temperatures, and monitoring and verification of controls in place is the main focus.
- Monitoring discarding of adulterated foods, and issuing hold orders, and condemning food products on site, as necessary.

(ESF-12) ENERGY

- TVA tower has been destroyed and power lines are down at the old prison known as the Castle

- 35,222 reported power outages in Davidson County
- 4,945 reported power outages in Wilson County
- 8,000 reported power outages in the Upper Cumberland area
- TVA line is down in the Cumberland River, impeding river traffic until it can be recovered.
- NES believes at this time that most transmission and substation delivery will be back up by Friday.
- Most customers without power that can accept power (meaning there is no structural or electrical safety concerns) should have power by Monday, per NES.
- NES has been able to secure 400 additional linemen to assist with restoration efforts.
- Multiple fuel partners reporting terminals along the Cumberland river are without power and unable to deliver fuel to tanker trucks until power is restored.
- 3/5 Fuel wholesalers are without power in downtown corridor, 2 major fuel terminals without power along the Cumberland River
- No reports of fuel outages at this time.

Human Needs Branch

(ESF-6) HUMAN SERVICES

- ARC will be operating a mass care operation for the rest of the week, including sheltering and feeding. Mobile feeding and bulk distribution of supplies, if needed could start in 2-3 days.
 - Multi Agency Resource Center (MARC) planning in process – currently working on 2 locations, looking at a possible 3rd.
 - Currently working on identifying organizations that will be involved in the MARC.
 - Human Services on standby for damage assessments
 - TNhousingsearch.org is messaging property providers, landlords, and apartment managers in 23 central counties including the 4 with tornado damage.
